Submit Preliminary Environmental Assessment and request for Part 3A assessment to DPI. *(On 21 March 2014 the Planning Minister announced the transition of the project from transitional Part 3A to 'State Significant Development' under Part 4 of the EP&A Act 1979)*

Director General's Requirements issued by DPI.

3

Preparation and submission of the Environmental Assessment to DPI.

4

Adequacy review by DPI to decide if Environmental Assessment is acceptable for exhibition.

WE ARE HERE. Environmental Assessment publicly exhibited by DPI for review & comment.

6

Epuron responds to submissions.
