The Windy Year in Review

Silverton Wind Farm (below), located 25 km from Broken Hill, is under construction by Powering Australian Renewables Fund, which acquired the project from AGL in January 2017. The 200 MW wind farm was developed by Epuron and commenced generation to the grid in May 2018.



White Rock Wind Farm (right) is seeking approval for planning modification to enable construction of the 2nd stage (171 MW) in 2019.



Coppabella Wind Farm was acquired from Epuron by Goldwind. All state and federal planning approvals have been secured and the project is being prepared for construction to commence in 2019.

Rye Park Wind Farm, acquired by Tilt Renewables, has received all approvals and is ready for construction in 2019.



Farm achieved State and Federal approvals in 2018 and is being prepared for the next phase of development prior to construction.



Wind Farms in the planning stage:

- **Bowmans Creek Wind Farm** Consultation underway for this project near Muswellbrook in the Hunter region of NSW.
- Western Plains Wind Farm Planning documents for the NW Tasmanian wind farm are to be lodged early 2019.

Strong Yields for Epuron Solar Assets

Epuron continues to grow and optimise its solar portfolio, which has been enjoying a world class solar resource since 2012. We have embraced advances in battery technology and rolled out Toshiba lithium-ion titanate batteries to Ti Tree and Kalkarindji in 2017 & 2018. These battery systems, with *CloudCAM* cloud prediction, enable high solar penetration (>80%) for remote power systems in the NT and reduce diesel consumption significantly. Epuron's Solar Asset Manager also recently met with industry experts in Alice Springs to discuss the growth of high penetration solar on the NT grid as part of ARENA's A-Lab program.



A Bright Year for Epuron Solar Developments

2018 saw Epuron solar developments progressing in leaps and bounds. In 2016, Epuron commenced development of the 89 MW Clermont Solar Farm (below) in QLD. Now owned by Wirsol Energy, the project is in the late stages of construction and is expected to be energised imminently. Epuron's 132 MW Nevertire solar farm development in NSW commenced construction in 2018 by owners Elliott Green Power.

Epuron with Island Green Power has developed the Katherine Solar project which will be constructed in 2019. This is the first large utility scale project on the Darwin-Katherine grid and has a long term Power Purchase Agreement with retailer Jacana Energy. Katherine Solar will increase renewable energy use in the Northern Territory by 3 - 4% and help achieve the Northern Territory's "50% renewables by 2030" commitment.

Epuron's first Tasmanian solar farm developments are coming up apples with Wesley Vale (~15 MW) and George Town (~7 MW) achieving planning approvals in early 2018.

Epuron's ~30 MW Walgett Solar Farm (NSW) is well poised in one of the sunniest locations in Australia. Walgett Solar Farm signed a Power Purchase Agreement with The University of Technology Sydney (UTS) in November which will supply up to half of the university's energy demand. The project is targeting to start construction of stage 1 in 2019.
