
Burrendong Wind Farm

- Located on freehold, Crown & Water NSW land east of Lake Burrendong
- Participation in Water NSW Renewable Energy & Storage Program
- Expanded layout including Water NSW land with up to 105 wind turbines
- Assessed as a Major Project under Part 4 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act)
- ▶ Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) currently being revised to accommodate expanded layout

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Planning and Assessment Process – NSW

- Updated Scoping Report submitted
- SEARs issued by Dept of Planning & Environment (DPE)
- Preparation of EIS by proponent
- ▶ EIS reviewed by DPE
- ▶ EIS on exhibition and public submissions accepted
- Responses to public submissions provided by proponent
- ▶ Regulatory assessment and determination (DPE & IPC)

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Planning & Assessment Process - Commonwealth

- Updated EPBC referral submitted
- ▶ Any additional EPBC biodiversity assessment requirements issued to the proponent and DPE for incorporation into SEARs
- ▶ Bilateral assessment by NSW DPE Biodiversity & Conservation Division
- ► Commonwealth Department of Agriculture Water & the Environment (DAWE) reviews recommended conditions of consent related to biodiversity
- ▶ DAWE issues EPBC approval



Timeline

- ▶ Updated EPBC referral lodged 2 March 2022
- ▶ Updated Scoping Report lodged 8 March 2022
- ▶ EIS lodged & public exhibition Q3 2022
- ► Expected project approvals Q2 2023
- ▶ Expected construction commencement 2024

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Epuron and Ark Energy

- ▶ Epuron signed a sale agreement with Ark Energy Corporation in December 2021
- ▶ Further steps before the completion of sale in coming months
- Ark Energy is an Australian subsidiary of Korea Zinc for more information see arkenergy.com.au
- ▶ Plans for Burrendong Wind Farm will not be affected by the change in ownership
